Fishery Assessment Outcomes (1)

- The fishery assessment process looks for written evidence to compare the performance of the fishery against requirements set out in the Code of Conduct for Responsible Fishing.
- The main areas of interest include
 - the laws and regulations that govern fishing in general and how they are enforced
 - specific rules controlling purse seining for sardines in the areas of interest
 - the level of knowledge about the health of the fish stocks
 - knowledge about other species caught whilst fishing for sardines
 - the impacts of fishing on endangered species, habitats and the wider ecosystem
- It should be noted that few, if any, fisheries have no gaps

Mr. Duncan explained each slide about the assessment criteria used to assess the data send by our team to the RS standards and he managed to get feedback from the guests present in the morning session. **Mr. Imran Mukudam**, Chairman, Mirkarwada Adarsh Machchimmar Society, Ratnagiri had said mostly 95% of fish will be of same species if caught by purseine nets. Endangered species like turtles are not caught in nets since it is considered as crime by wild life department.

Why is this? The fisheries are managed by clearly identified agencies that operate under Indian law. The agencies have written commitments to sustainability and have mechanisms in place for consultation and reporting

Why is this? There is no assessment available of the health of the sardine stock(s)

Mr. Duncan explained that the information regarding the sardine stock is not detailed to know the exact volume, removals and migration of sardine stock in Indian coast. Detailed study need to be conducted to know more about Indian Oil sardines. Institutes like **CMFRI** can help us to fill this gap he added.

Why is this? There is no link between current controls on the fishery and the ability of the stock to handle fishing pressure

Mr. Duncan mentioned, lot of work is to be done in this point regarding harvest strategy and stock status. **Mr. Shirdhanker HOD/Professor**, College of Fisheries, Ratnagiri has offered that student from his college can handle many of the projects which is identified as a gap in the assessment report if financially supported.

Why is this? There is a lack of clarity regarding which agency is responsible for which aspects of enforcing the law, especially in Maharashtra State. There is an absence of information available on monitoring and enforcement

Mr. Salunkhe Assistant Commissioner of Fisheries, Ratnagiri have mentioned that in Maharashtra each coastal district have 1 patrolling boat and Goa state have total 2 boats for patrolling. Since the area is wider the enforcement and patrolling is not effective has expected.

After the lunch break **Madam Leela Edwin** had joined the meeting for the last session. After she joined in. The work shop become more interactive and she explained that few gaps which was identified by the RS Standard can be addressed through various studies conducted by CMFRI and CIFT institutes. She accept our request to talk with the CIFT director regarding the co-operation with our FIP project.

Why is this? There is largely a lack of information available about the role of sardines in the wider marine ecosystem

Mr. Duncan said regarding the ecosystem impacts on sardine fisheries have no evidence to prove the impacts on predators like dolphin and shark. No study has been conducted on this area and no data available. **Madam Leela Edwin** informed that there are study being conducted in **CIFT** on bottle nose dolphins, Sea turtles and other endangered species.

Mr. Rohit Sancelcar, Manager, Zuari Marketing Fisheries Co-operative Society, Goa also expressed his idea about the sardine fisheries and its environment impacts. He also informed that rarely sea turtle and dolphins are accidentally caught in purseine nets but it will be released immediately into sea by fishermen.

Panaji: The government and selected fishermen societies in India are jointly drafting the country's first-ever action plan as part of the Fishery Improvement Project (FIP) for Indian oil sardine in Goa and Maharashtra in a bid to preserve the Indian oil sardine stock along the west coast.

The steering committee made up of the fishery assessment methodology of the International Fishmeal and Fish Oil Organisation the latest version of IFPO Responsible Supply Standard (IFPO RS), which is an internationally accepted standard designed specifically for responsible fisheries according to UN FAO Code

of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries, which was developed, in part, by the government of India.
